Developing Independence

Over the next few weeks and months we will be having a whole school focus on developing independence, resilience and maturity. We have designed a KSJ guide to what we expect this to look like at each year group, which I will be sharing with you in the coming weeks.

Each class will be focusing upon the 'The 5 Bees'. This means children will be encouraged to use:-

Brain (try to solve it first by thinking about it)

Book (prior learning in their book, dictionary or spelling journal)

Board (modelled learning from the teacher on the board)

Buddy (can others nearby help out or a friend)

Boss (the teacher is always happy to help you when you have tried first)

Attendance

School gate opens at 8.35am

School bell rings at 8.45am signalling the start if the school day

Gate is closed from 8.50am when all pupils are expected to be in school and ready for learning.

9.00am is the time when registers close.

9.00am - 9.15am arrival is a Late in the register

Arrival after 9.15am is an unauthorised absence for that morning session.

Expectations

A reminder of our expectations (unless reasonable adjustments are agreed)

Long hair will be tied back

Black or grey trousers, shorts or leggings or grey skirts

Blue jumper/cardigan and white shirt/ polo shirt

Black shoes – trainers are acceptable if black. Children should not wear heels. Wellington boots should be changed into black school shoes on arrival at school.

Children are not encouraged to wear jewellery. Stud earrings are permitted, but will need to be removed for PE. A small number of children refuse to remove earrings and request tape or plasters to cover them. This is not something school can facilitate and if parents wish for this to be procedure, will need to provide micropore tape to their child to independently use, or remove earrings for the PE days at home, if their child is unable to remove them.

Spring Term Extra Curricular clubs

From September 2024 the following charges apply:-

• Morning session 7:30 to 8:45am = £6.50 (please ensure children are not left

before 7:30am)

- Early pick up After school session 3:15 to 4:30pm = £8.00 (tea is served at 4:30pm so if pick up is after this time, you will be charged the full amount).
- Full after session 3:15 to 6:00pm = £10.00 (this will include a healthy and varied evening tea.)
- Breakfast and Early pick up = £14.50
- Breakfast and late pick up = £16.50
